The announcement was made yesterday by Ben Linn, president of the local chapter and former University of California football coach.

Linn disclosed that an outstanding lineman and back from nine North State counties will be chosen by a prep superintendent or principal, a coach and sports reporter from each section.

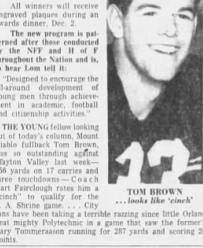
In addition to San Francisco, where the selection committee is made up of G. J. Schmalz, Washington principal; Mill Ave. Polytechnic mentor, and the writer, the counties participating in the program are Marin, Sonoma, Napa, Solano, Contra Costa, Alameda, Santa Clara and San Mateo.

All winners will receive engraved plaques during an awards dinner Dec. 2.
