Sound Groundwork Will Be Cardinal Principle

And here is another fine feature of the Junior Birdman coursesinstead of confining you to certain forms of constructions, instead of limiting your work to certain models and certain kits, they will direct you in your experiments. They will allow you to discover for yourself just how and why the laws of aerodynamics are what they are. By such a policy you will be given a sound groundwork in the principles that are the basis of the entire science of aviation.

That is really what we want to do, isn't it-learn aviation. If we should merely learn to put little sticks and pieces of paper together to form a thing that will fly, without learning WHY it will fly, we wouldn't even have scratched the surface of our subject.

So watch for these articles beginning Friday. Study them carefully, right from the start.

Now something about memberships. How the squadrons are rolling in! Last Friday there were a dozen squadron meetings in San Francisco alone And one of them had forty members!

Burning Throat Only Sign of Fire






