

SHRINE WILL BE DEDICATED AT VETS BUILDING

For one evening next week all of San Francisco's American Legionnaires will become "Shriners." No switching of organization, however, the change will merely be on the technical order of a bad pun—for the Legionnaires will spend next Wednesday evening in Vets' Auditorium, paying tribute to their newest and proudest acquisition, a large marble shrine.

It's a replica of the Shrine of the Constitution, which houses the democracy's "charter papers" in Washington's Library of Congress. And it's being given to San Francisco's Legionnaires by a local department store.

To be housed permanently in the foyer of Vets' Building, the shrine is the only one of its kind in California. Wednesday's dedication ceremonies will be handled jointly by the San Francisco County Council, Seventh and Eighth Districts of the Legion.

Refugee Boy's Prayer Gives Thanks to U. S. HAPPY TO BE IN COUNTRY WITH BRIGHT FUTURE

NEW YORK, March 30.—(AP)—A prayer of thanksgiving projected 16-year-old Martin Marden, a messenger boy, into the limelight today. Marden, who fled from Nazi Germany with his widowed mother and her two other children three years ago, wrote the prayer in sheer joy at finding himself in a land where the future seems bright and hopeful, rather than dark and hopeless.

Published in a high school magazine, it attracted the attention of Superintendent of Schools Harold G. Campbell who, saying it should be "read by every American," sent copies to President Roosevelt and Secretary of State Hull.
