The Board of Education Announces Assignments of Teachers, Transfers and Leaves of Absence.

At the meeting of the Board of Education yesterday, Superintendent Webster submitted a plan for the expenditure of the Hochstadter bequest...

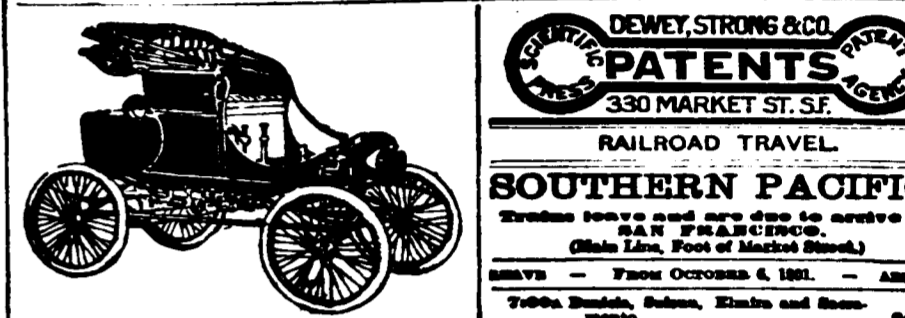
