

CORBIN'S COLONEL TELLS THE STORY OF THE GENERAL'S DISGRACE

Says His Subordinates Reported That Officer as Having Betrayed Cowardice in the Face of the Foe at the Nashville Battle. Tendered His Resignation When Taxed With His Offense, but Subsequently Withdrawn It and Was Acquitted by Court-Martial.

NEW YORK, March 7.—J. T. Morgan, chief clerk of the department of the general staff, has written an account of the "disgrace" which befell the late General Corbin's military career during the Civil War. The story is told in a book which is now being prepared to be published by the War Department. It is the first time that the details of the Nashville battle have been made public.

General Corbin's letter deals particularly with the battle at Nashville, Tenn., Dec. 15, 1862. It is a full and complete account of the battle, and is a most interesting and valuable contribution to the history of the war.

Writing of the battle Corbin says: "I was in the front of the Confederate line, and I saw the general's conduct during the battle. He was cowardly and he betrayed the confidence of his subordinates."
