TROLLEYS FOR MARKET STREET
It was announced yesterday by Mayor Schmitt that he had granted a temporary franchise to the United Railroads for a trolley line on Market street to the ferry, to be operated during his pleasure or until revoked.
The intention is to clear Market street of debris as rapidly as possible, dynamiting the standing walls, now a menace to life, and hauling away the debris on flat cars, thus opening the street to traffic. It is believed that the tracks are very little injured and that they can quickly be put in condition for use. The company says that it can put up a temporary overhead construction very quickly.
The United Railroads has offered its lines to the Mayor to carry the people, with their bags and baggage, free of charge. In order to get their lines in condition to operate for this purpose all of its men have been working day and night. Saturday, April 21st, it informed the Mayor that it was ready to safely operate its line from Broadway down Fillmore street through Church and Sixteenth streets to Bryant street. Several careful examinations were made by its engineers and electricians, who found that the line could be operated without the slightest danger. The Mayor ordered the cars to be run, and they were run from 7:30 P. M. Saturday, April 21st, to 12:35 P. M. Sunday, April 22d. The cars were greeted with cheers by the people along the line, and the crowds that greeted them gladly welcomed the relief. No mishap or danger of any kind occurred.
After the cars had been running some time Rudolph Spreckels, chairman of the lighting committee, stated to the Mayor that he feared there might possibly be some danger, and at the request of the Mayor the cars were stopped.
The Fillmore-street line stands ready to be operated safely, and is at the disposal of the Mayor and ready to run and transport passengers free immediately upon receiving orders from him. Within a day or two the Mission-street line will be ready to operate safely from near the ferry to the county line. Also, the line from Bryant street to Kentucky avenue and from Kentucky avenue to Twenty-third street. Also the line from Twenty-sixth street to San Bruno avenue and Dwight street; also the line from Fillmore street to Van Ness avenue, and Fillmore street to Haight and Stanyan; also from Van Ness avenue to Sixth street and California street via Sacramento street.
This covers nearly all of the company's electric lines, and furnishes free transportation to practically every section of the city, including the crowded district. These lines, when in condition, will be operated for carrying passengers and supplies free as soon as directed by the Mayor. In order to supply power for this purpose the company has had to use salt water in its boilers, although the use of it is unkind to the boilers. The company has literally placed its lines at the service of the people.
All the cars of the company now standing in the streets are at the disposal of the people for shelter and lighting.
Yesterday afternoon the United Railroads had a force of conductors and motormen at work sweeping the street from Octavia to the ferry. At the same time iron poles were being erected along the line of the curbs, as it is intended to run trolley cars to the ferry as soon as the street is clear and the dangerous walls are removed.
It is believed that by to-day street car traffic will be resumed on all the electric lines in that part of the city that escaped by fire.

BOARD OF HEALTH ORDERS
All householders and persons camping in public squares or other places are directed to remove all garbage and refuse from their premises to curb line of street for removal to crematory.
This rule must be strictly observed in order to protect the health of the city.

Word was received yesterday that Inverness, Marin county, was completely destroyed by the earthquake. No lives were lost, though the houses on the bluff toppled into the sea and the stage road was destroyed.

DELAY EXTRA SESSION CALL.

CLIFF HOUSE STILL STANDS
The historic Cliff House, despite its apparently dangerous position, was virtually unharmed by the earthquake. A thorough inspection of the building was made yesterday and it was found that the damage will not exceed \$500. The escape of the Cliff House, hanging as it does on a rock on the ocean's edge, may be regarded as one of the most curious of the freaks of the earthquake.
Down the beach south of the Cliff House are many refugees, who suffer somewhat from the cold at night, but who are being fed plentifully. As soon as water can be secured at the Cliff House, that big building will be thrown open to the homeless.
