HOPE, NOT FEAR, IS SAN FRANCISCO'S WATCHWORD

In times of stress like these there are never lacking rumors of the most startling additional disasters. The minds of people are so accustomed to dismay and distress that these words will not fail of credence, and so it is natural that the military authorities and the Mayor to issue a formal denial of the widely circulated statement that an epidemic was raging in the camps of the refugees.

NEVER can San Francisco forget the nobility of Oakland. Perhaps the greatest stroke of good fortune in the general story of disaster was the fact that the big city on the eastern shore of the bay escaped the scourge of fire and was comparatively little damaged by the earthquake. To be sure Oakland had been seriously shaken, but the great-hearted people of the city at once forgot their own losses in the effort to relieve the superior affliction of San Francisco.

And surely no people in the world in a time of stress shared a more glorious generosity than did the citizens of Oakland. As once they open their homes to the refugees from the stricken metropolis, rich and poor stretch with each other in the effort to excel in deeds of unselfish kindness.
